Dawn Oertel	<p>Classes 1, 2, and 3 Shape it with Stitches</p> <p>Class will include signature triangle shape See how one detail can change a project - tool options, shaping choices and knit opportunities to make it "original, by design".</p>
Dawn Oertel	<p>Class 4 - Attendee's Choice Shape it with Details</p> <p>Escape the expected and explore finishing tips that are worked throughout your project. Let's celebrate the personal touches that make your piece unique.</p>

Carol Scott	<p>Class 4 - Attendee's Choice Nifty Necklines</p> <p>Necklines are the focal point of any garment. Learn shortcuts for traditional, short-rowed, and cut & sew shaping. Then see what you can do with bands, rolls, trims, and easy bind-offs. Necklines will never scare you again!</p>

Michelle Goodhand	<p>Classes 1, 2, and 3 NO TRANSFER LACEY FABRICS</p> <p>Easy drop stitch bubbles for scarves, shawls and ponchos. Crochet look mesh stitch for sweater cuffs, shawls and scarves.</p>
Michelle Goodhand	<p>Class 4 - Attendee's Choice POTLUCK</p> <p>Decorative woven cast on, eyelet cast on, slipped edge stitches, vertical stripes for making plaids, mock cable edge and more!</p>
Dawn Oertel	<p>Classes 1, 2, and 3 Shape it with Rows</p> <p>Explore bias and short row knitting to get the angle. One shape, infinite style when you add stripes, lace or beads.</p>
Dawn Oertel	<p>Class 4 - Attendee's Choice You can do that... BLEACH IT!</p> <p>"Stunning meets simple" with this creative opportunity. Learn how-to use bleach to create a design on your knits.</p>
Carol Scott	<p>Classes 1, 2, and 3 Simply Slip Stitch</p> <p>Who knew that not knitting stitches would produce such glorious results? Slipping strategic stitches can be functional as well as decorative. You will learn to use slip stitch in functional ways as well as to create knits with subtle designs or crazy texture.</p>
Carol Scott	<p>Class 4 - Attendee's Choice Trendy Tuck Stitch</p> <p>The tuck stitch is formed when the yarn passes over the needle but does not knit on selected needles. The unknit strands of yarn are knitted in subsequent rows to form a lift or tucked stitch. Many interesting patterns and effects can be knit with this easy but often overlooked technique. Be amazed with what you can do!</p>
