Bring _____ needles to work	50	54	58	62	66	74
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Push every other needle out of work. E-wrap cast on.
 Knit 1 row T 9. Hang cast on comb. Keep empty

Knit to row _____	23	29	33	35	39	49
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Put 1/2 of all needles, on the thumb side, into hold. Put 1 stitch on carriage side into hold now, and and every row until _____ stitches remain. Knit 1 row, then reverse short-row shaping opposite the carriage until all shaped needles are in work.	13	13	15	15	19	21
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Keep 1/2 of all needles in hold on thumb side and continue on next page for lining.

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Lining

Shape the top of mitten lining (the 1/2 of all needles on the thumb side are still in hold).

Put 1 stitch on carriage side into hold now, and every row, until _____ stitches remain.

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**At this spot you can pick up the inside points of the shaping of the outer mitten and hang a stitch onto each edge needle of the stitches in work. This will help to keep the lining in place.

Knit 1 row and reverse short-row shaping opposite the carriage until all shaped needles are in work.

Knit to row _____

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Transfer stitches to every other needle, and with empty needles out of work, knit 1 row. Pick up the top of the hem where the e-wraps for the mock rib were hung for cuff and hang those e-wraps onto the needles in work and knit 1 row. Bind off loosely. Leave 24" tail for seaming.

The top of the mitten lining will fit into the top of the mitten, purl sides together, and the lining of the thumb will fit into the thumb of the outer mitten, again purl sides together. Match markers and shortrow shaping.

Seaming: Use a mattress stitch for the mock rib. From the outside of the mitten, you can slip stitch the lining closed, including the thumb, and up to the top of the mitten, and across the shortrowed section, and, hiding the thread between layers, then back down to the cuff use a mattress stitch. Or you can pick up the outside loop (not the knot) of the edge stitch on four layers at one time, in a whip stitch manner, seaming lining and outer mitten at the same time.

Knit RIGHT MITTEN / CARRIAGE ON LEFT and e-wrap with a long tail.
