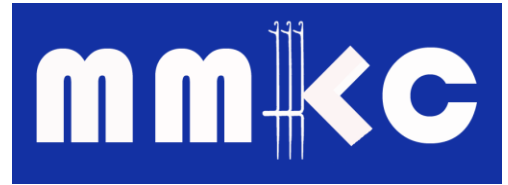


Supply List for MMKC Ribber Basics Class

These course materials assume a Japanese knitting machine.

- Flatbed Machine and ribber in good working order (MMKC does not do repairs or provide spare parts)
- Table/Stand that will support your flatbed machine and ribber
- Knitting Machine User Manual
- Ribber User Manual
- Machine Tools (all tools that came standard with your knitting machine and ribber)
- Double Eye Needle (mandatory)
- Transfer Carriage (optional)
- Two 7-Prong Transfer tools (optional)
- Scissors
- Measuring Tape
- Tapestry Needle or Chibi (optional)
- Ravel cord
- Spiral Notebook or Composition book for notes
- Pen/Pencil
- Chair cushion/pad (Optional)
- Yarn – See Yarn Recommendations



Yarn Recommendations:

One of the most challenging aspects of this course is the yarn recommendation list. Based on the gauges of machines and the plethora of yarn available, as long as attendees bring yarn that suits machine gauge and are suitable for the purposes of learning, we can pretty much guarantee success. We've provided a list of yarns currently available but if you have other yarns in your stash and are wondering if they will work, please reach out to us – mmkc.mn@gmail.com.

We do not recommend very fine hard dress yarns or yarns that are fingering weight or lighter. We have watched new knitters struggle with yarns that are too fine, too bulky, or novelty yarns that are difficult. We applaud your desire to use whatever you want but for purposes of learning, please try to use of the following types of yarn – these are suggestions.

Light colored yarns work best in a learning environment. Bring enough yarn to make samples and a project. To ensure you have enough yarn, please bring 12 to 16 ounces of main color and 4 ounces of contrast color.

Standard Gauge Machine (4.5mm)

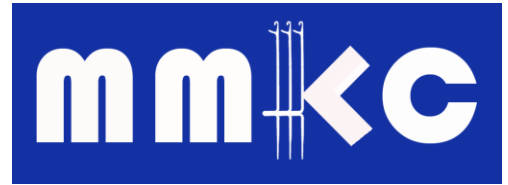
- Tamm 3-Ply
 - Suggested Tension 3/3
- Tamm Cancun
 - Suggested Tension 5/5
- Tamm Sport
 - Suggested Tension 4/4
- Tamm Trenzi
 - Suggested Tension 3/3

Mid-Gauge Machine (6.5 or 7 mm) – metal bed machine with ribber (Brother KX350 and Silver Reed LK150 not suitable for this class)

- Tamm Nordic
 - Suggested Tension 3/3
- Lion Brand Wool Ease Worsted
 - Suggested Tension 3/3
- Malabrigo Rios
 - Suggested Tension 3/3

Bulky Gauge Machine (9mm)

- Tamm Nordic
 - Suggested Tension 2/2
- Lion Wool Ease Worsted
 - Suggested Tension 1/1
- Malabrigo Worsted
 - Suggested Tension 1/1



Other yarns which you may have in your stash (some of these are discontinued but do seem to be part of everyone's yarn stash) and are suitable include:

- **Standard** – Millor Trenzado, Tamm Rayito, Mary Lue's Symphony
- **Mid-Gauge** – Mary Lue's Liberty Plus, Mary Lue's Schuss Plus
- **Bulky** – Mary Lue's Schuss Plus, 2 strands of any of the yarns listed above in the Standard Gauge list.

How much yarn should you bring? A one pound cone or 454 grams is sufficient.
